2021 FAPAC LEADERSHIP SHADOWING PROGRAM (LSP) ANNOUNCEMENT

ACCEPTING APPLICATIONS NOW!

The Federal Asian Pacific American Council (FAPAC) is now accepting applications for the *FAPAC Leadership Shadowing Program (LSP) in 2021*. The program kicks off in March 2021 and runs through September 2021. It concludes with a graduation in October 2021. The 2021 FAPAC LSP Orientation and Graduation will be held **virtually**.

The focus of the Leadership Shadowing Program (LSP) is for interested *Qualified FAPAC Members* to get a closer look of the roles and responsibilities of the organization by shadowing its Elected Officials and Committee Chairs and Co-Chairs.

The first phase of the LSP begins with shadowing FAPAC Committee Chairs and Co-Chairs (National Board of Operations), and familiar with Committees duties and tasks by participating in projects and events throughout the first six (6) months of the LSP period.

The second phase of the LSP starts with shadowing FAPAC Officers (National Board of Directors). The expected result of the LSP shadowees/participants will be having insight of which leadership roles they may be interested in leading and running for the election in FY2022. Whether to run during the FAPAC election in FY2022 for an elected position as officer, auditor or volunteer be a committee member.

Who May Apply?

- Only Active FAPAC Regular Member and Lifetime Regular Member during the last 12 months and in good standing to run for Elected Position during the FAPAC FY 2022 Election Cycle; and
- Associate and Honorary members have all the rights and privileges; however, they <u>are not eligible to hold elected office position</u>.

Leadership Shadowing Program objectives include:

- Develop and improve business skills and leadership competency by formal and informal leadership trainings
- Observe and participate in business operations and decision-making to shape a diverse network of dedicated leaders in the federal government
- Expand professional network in non-federal sectors through various leadership functions, communications and training activities
